# Spencer Tracy, a Modest, Prolific 'Regular Guy'

67 yesterday after a heart attack in Hollywood,was a serious actor who didn't arrive in the movie capital until after his 30th birthday.

By then, he had appeared in more than 230 stage productions. He was a complicated man who was willing to work hard for a living. And, in the more than 60 subsequent films, he did just that.

Mr. Tracy once said he thought Sir Laurence Olivier was the wtrld's best actor... Others gave the same accolade to Mr. Tracy himself. He chuckled at those who did.

He was, certainly, one of the best and most popular that Hollywood has produced. But it would be hard to give Hollycredit for Spencer

Louella Parsons or Hedda Hopper probably never saw him dining at the Brown Derby. Mr. Tracy didn't like the Brown Derby or any of Hollywood's famous haunts. He never had a personal press agent. But he did have a full life, full of more recognizably human problems than most movie stars seem to suffer.

He made millions of dollars. but never stopped working. He finished his 'last film, "Guess Who's Coming for Dinfriend and confidante.
